This new building, named in memory of a former Board of Trustee member, will mark the first addition since the museum opened in the SS&TP in 2009. Also, the Museum's board was one of three nonprofit boards to win in the *Best Boards* category at the Albuquerque Business First 2022 Philanthropy Awards.
