BlueHalo Continues to Expand Facilities

A former Raytheon building on Eubank Boulevard in the SS&TP was leased by BlueHalo. The company's manufacturing facilities are now increasing from their original footprint of about 50,000 square feet to over 200,000 square feet. BlueHalo plans to move into the building, their third facility in the Park, in the fall. The company provides capabilities in the domains of Space Superiority and Directed Energy, Missile Defense and C4ISR, and Cyber and Intelligence. BlueHalo has contracts with Sandia National Laboratories and the Air Force Research Laboratory's Directed Energy and Space Vehicles Directorates.
