The Sandia Science & Technology Park (SS&TP) announced the results of an economic impact analysis. Sandia National Laboratories Director James Peery and Albuquerque Mayor Tim Keller praised findings of the new report, which is based on an assessment done every two years by the Mid-Region Council of Governments (MRCOG).

Mary Monson, Sandia; Dewey Cave, MRCOG; and Sherman McCorkle, Sandia Science & Technology Park Development Corporation also commended the Park on its success.

The independent report highlights the Park's impact in the local community. The SS&TP companies and organizations create jobs, generate large sums of state and local tax revenues, and pay higher-than-average wages for its employees when compared with the average wage in the Albuquerque metro area.
