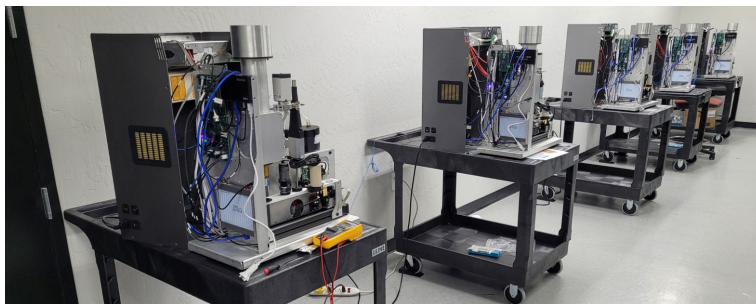

BioFlyte Receives SBIR Phase 1 Contract

BioFlyte has been awarded a Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Phase I contract by AFWERX, the innovation arm of the Department of the Air Force and a directorate within the Air Force Research Laboratory. This contract focuses on BioFlyte's BioTOF™ z200 dynamic threat monitoring solution, which aims to address challenges in critical infrastructure protection. The goal is to demonstrate the capability of BioFlyte's aerosol threat detection and identification technology to protect military personnel and infrastructure from known and emerging biological and chemical threats.
