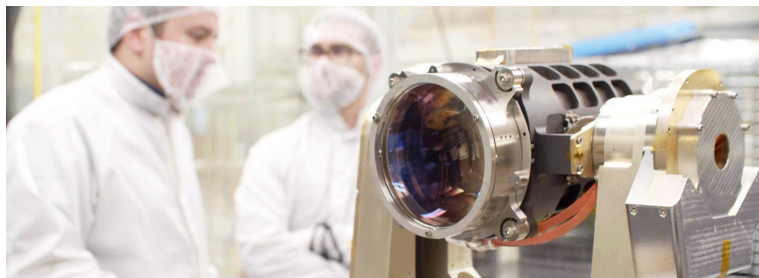
The SS&TP is pleased to share some highlights from the past year. We wish you a joyful, innovative, and successful 2026!

GROWTH

Four new companies moved into the SS&TP: **Advanced Inspection Services**, **Genuen**, **IB3 Global Solutions**, and **I-Pulse Albuquerque**.

AeroVironment acquired **BlueHalo**. Together, they formed **AV**, a company specializing in autonomous systems, precision strike systems, counter-UAS technologies, and cyber and electronic warfare capabilities.

AV secured a \$240 million contract to deploy long-haul laser communications terminals in orbit, enabling high-speed, secure data transfer with greater range and reliability than traditional satellite methods.



BioFlyte was awarded SBIR Phase I and Phase II contracts from the **U.S. Air Force** for its BioTOF z200™ threat detection solution.

GridFlow partnered with **Sandia National Laboratories** through the New Mexico Small Business Assistance Program, receiving \$60,000 in assistance to enhance its lithium-specific membrane. The company is licensing technology from Sandia.

Peerless Technologies relocated its office from one building to another in the SS&TP, now leasing 2,535 square feet of office space.

Phoenix Analysis and Design Technologies became the first U.S. and Canada reseller of UK-based Rapid Fusion's products, enhancing its Large Format Additive Manufacturing offerings for composite materials.

PNM is constructing the 60 MW Sandia Energy Storage System facility on a 5.3-acre site it owns. The facility will enhance energy reliability for southeast Albuquerque, Sandia, and the SS&TP.



Rocket Lab received a contract from Airbus Constellation Satellites to provide 200 solar panels for 100 OneWeb satellites for Eutelsat Group, enabling global internet access to remote and underserved regions.

OUTREACH & COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

At the **Kirtland Partnership Committee's** annual meeting, **Kirtland Air Force Base** Commander Colonel Justin Secrest spoke about KAFB's \$7.5B local economic impact for FY2024, and Sandia Laboratories Director Laura McGill discussed Sandia's contributions to the economy.

The **City of Albuquerque's Public Art Urban Enhancement Division** has commissioned **Ball-Nogues Studio** to create a public art sculpture in collaboration with SS&TP companies **AV**, **IDEAS Engineering & Technology**, **Rocket Lab**, and **TEAM Technologies**.

The **SS&TP Community Advisory Council** gathered at the **Sunward Credit Union** in the Park to hear about the SS&TP's achievements over the past year and presentations from **Sunward**, **Advanced Inspection Services**, **Genuen**, **PNM**, and **Ball-Nogues Studio**.



Two **SS&TP Company Leadership Luncheons** were held, with one event sponsored and hosted by **Cooperative Educational Services** and the other by the **National Museum of Nuclear Science & History**.

In partnership with **Vitalant**, four blood drives were held that resulted in 52 donors and 67 units of blood collected, potentially impacting 201 lives.

Kirtland Partnership Committee Executive Director Megan DeLaRosa received the Rising Star Award from the **Albuquerque Regional Economic Alliance**.

The **National Museum of Nuclear Science & History** was recognized as one of Albuquerque Business First's 2025 Best Places to Work.

The **New Mexico School for the Blind and Visually Impaired** and Park partner **New Mexico State Land Office** were recognized by the Albuquerque Journal as New Mexico Top Workplaces for 2025.
