#### Stone Lion Gets Contract with Sandia

The company was recently awarded a radio frequency identification (RFID) contract in support of the chemical inventory system (CIS) at Sandia. 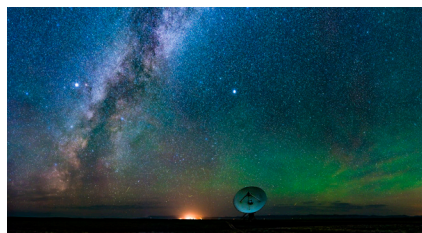

#### Qynergy Wins Two Large Contracts

The company was awarded a \$1.1M contract from the Missile Defense Agency for developing an "Improved MgO Binder for Thermal Batteries". This program will position them to be a supplier of a critical material for thermal battery manufacturers. Qynergy was also awarded a \$150K contract from the Office of Naval Research for developing a "Dissolved Oxygen Power Cell". Qynergy occupies space at TEAM Technologies, located in the SS&TP.

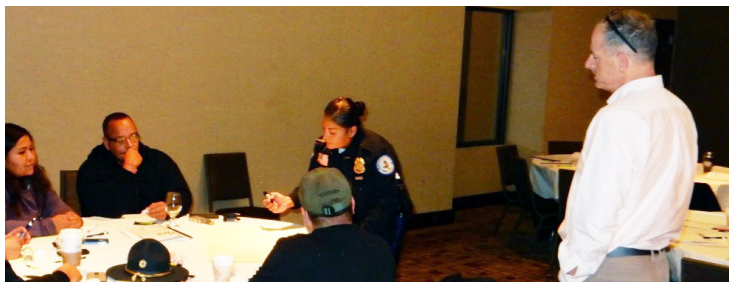
