Economic Impact Assessment News Conference announced \$4.4B in wages and salaries, \$2.6B worth of economic activity, and more than \$103M in tax revenue for the State and \$15.2M for the City since the SS&TP was established in 1998.

MCAD merged with Computer Aided Technology, Inc. and is now called MCAD Technologies.

The New Mexico School for the Blind and Visually Impaired was recognized by the Albuquerque Journal as a 2015 Top Workplace in New Mexico and ranked #1 among mid-sized companies with 150-500 employees.
