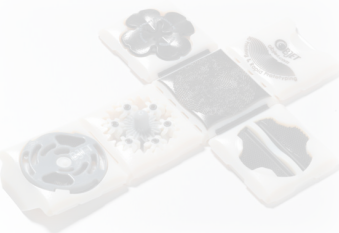

TEAM Technologies – The Association of University Research Parks (AURP) 2011 Innovation Award was presented to TEAM Technologies for the commercialization of the Stingray, a device that shoots a thin blade of water capable of penetrating steel and disabling improvised explosive devices (IEDs). The Stingray, a technology based on a license from SNL, is a dramatic improvement in water disruption tool technology, and it is already being used in warzones by the military. AURP is a professional association of university related research and science parks and its mission is to foster innovation, commercialization, and economic growth through university, industry, and government partnerships.
