


Park Companies Participate in Manufacturing Day

ATA Wins Contract for Counter-UAS DEW

Applied Technology Associates (ATA) was awarded a \$17.7 million other prototype project agreement from the U.S. Air Force. The agreement is to obtain a ground-based Directed Energy Weapon (DEW) prototype for the purpose of fixed-site Air Force Air Base Air Defense against unmanned aerospace system (UAS) threats. This project involves the development, assembly, and ultimately test of a prototype DEW in an operationally relevant environment.
