TekSynap Opens Office

TekSynap, headquartered in Virginia, has operated in Albuquerque since 2016 and recently moved into the TEAM Technologies building located in the Sandia Science & Technology Park (SS&TP). The space is now the company's local office with three employees serving their four existing contracts on Kirtland Air Force Base. TekSynap is a growing small business providing Information Technology to meet the business needs of their customers.





ATA and SolAero Win STAR Contracts

Two SS&TP companies won contracts from the Air Force Research Laboratory Space Vehicles Directorate's Space Technology Advanced Research, or STAR, program. STAR streamlines contract awards through rapid review and approval of proposals. Applied Technology Associates (ATA) was awarded a \$16.9 million contract to provide a communication system with two-way time transfer operating within W/V-bands and incorporating Free Space Optical (FSO) links. SolAero Technologies, which makes robust solar systems for spacecraft, received \$4.5 million to develop automated processes for building solar modules to speed production and lower costs.





PADT Expands 3D Printing System Sales

PADT is a globally recognized provider of numerical simulation, product development, and 3D printing products and services. PADT's early success in key markets in Southwestern states like Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, and Utah has facilitated their expansion into Texas, first with Ansys simulation software and now with Stratasys 3D production systems and printing materials. PADT will provide maintenance and repair services to customers in Texas from their SS&TP office.



SierTek-Peerless Joint Venture Wins Contracts

A joint venture between two defense contractors, Peerless Technologies, which has an office in the SS&TP and SierTek, was awarded four contracts under the General Services Administration's One Acquisition Solution for Integrated Services (OASIS) program. The SierTek-Peerless Joint Venture win of these OASIS contracts will enable two nationally recognized firms to partner in solving issues of national security and serving federal clients all over the world. Both companies have ties to Kirtland Air Force Base.
